Taking part in the Ice and Fire Docs was a truly transformative experience for me as a filmmaker. The process challenged me to look at my material and my story with fresh eyes, and to push beyond familiar ways of thinking.

What impressed me most was the inspiring, supportive atmosphere: the tutors and peers created a safe but demanding environment where I gained the confidence to rediscover my familiar subject matter and to understand what really resonates with others. This was crucial, because a film is never only the director's interpretation – it is also a piece of art that comes fully alive only in dialogue with its audience.

The development process itself was particularly enriching because of the hybrid encounter between experienced filmmakers and younger voices. This mix generated a creative energy where new perspectives could flourish alongside tested wisdom. Looking back, I am certain that Lynx Man would not have become the widely resonant, award-winning film it is today without the unique encouragement, openness, and vision of the Ice and Fire Docs process.



JUHA SUONPÄÄ

DIRECTOR

Juha Suonpää (b. 1963) is an Adjunct Professor in Art, Environmental and Nature Photography, a photographer and filmmaker. Suonpää works as the principal lecturer of visual culture in the International Degree Programme in Media and Arts at Tampere University of Applied Sciences. Suonpää has exhibited internationally and published documentary films, numerous academic monographs and articles and researched, for example, topics related to photography, visualising science and the construction of the identity of a place. Suonpää's earlier film Wolfman premiered at Visions du Réel Film Festival in 2013.

PASI HAKKIO

PRODUCER

Pasi Hakkio (b. 1986) is a Finnish Film Producer, who entered the film branch through a German company Bavaria Film. At the age of 24 he started his first production company and co-produced a German-Finnish children's movie Snow Queen, which was nominated twice for a German Grimme-Award. JAAN TOOTSEN

Ice and Fire Docs workshop has a truly unique creative environment. One of its steady guiding figures has been Mikael Opstrup from Denmark — an experienced producer who, with warmth and kindness yet firm resolve, has helped steer the "documentary vessel" through the often treacherous seas of filmmaking.

Our session was also joined by editor Jesper Osmund, a highly regarded editor with extensive international experience. With great sensitivity, he was able to draw out the uniqueness and strengths of each project, encouraging filmmakers to preserve and develop their distinct qualities.

Together, the two tutors created a broader framework — that of world cinema — where, ideally, every film from the workshop might eventually find its place. They challenged us to consider how each work, with all its imperfections and merits, could survive in such a demanding arena.

The atmosphere of the workshop was warm, supportive, and highly creative. Equally valuable was the feedback we received from fellow participants — in our case, both from Estonia and Finland — which enriched the process and strengthened our film.



JAAN TOOTSEN

DIRECTOR AND PRODUCER

Jaan Tootsen (b. 1975) is an award-winning Estonian filmmaker who has forged an acclaimed career with distinctive documentaries that beautifully encapsulate the personal, often hidden, human experience within a rich socio-political context. Tootsen debuted with The New World (2011), a vivid exploration of the urban anarchist-hipster community in Estonia's capital. His latest work, Rebel with a Bow Tie, is a distinctly non-political, wry observation of the most eccentric and consequential politician-you-probably-never-have-heard-of, Estonia's President Toomas Hendrik Ilves. Tootsen's non-conformist vision reveals the myriad fractures in the dynamic relationship between individuality and community, and marks him out as the latest of Estonia's "New Wave" filmmakers to invigorate global audiences through their bold, distinctive approach to cinematic storytelling.

LOGLINE:

After living apart for over 13 years Angela and Carlos, mother and son, reunite when she migrates from Colombia to Estonia. What begins as a playful documentary search for an imagined ancestor, becomes a journey into the pains of the past and the possibilities of the future.

SYNOPSIS:

Angela is moving from Colombia to Estonia. At age 62, she uprooted herself and decided to start a new life on the other side of the world, closer to her children. Carlos has been living in Estonia for 13 years. He ran away from Colombia, and now the wound that drove his family apart is coming together with his mother, Angela.

While Angela adjusts to Estonia and deals with the migration process, Carlos is making a film about roots, and Angela becomes a part of it. Together they imagine that they have an Estonian ancestor to justify them being in Estonia. They start playing games so they can exist together.

Angela does not talk about the wound, neither does Carlos. They share that silence. But the wound demands attention and the games crumble. The distance between Angela and

DIRECTOR

Carlos E. Lesmes is a Colombian film director currently based in Estonia. Graduated from Universidad Nacional de Colombia in 2010, and from the MA in Baltic Film and Arts School in 2014, Carlos has been an active member of the Estonian film community. Currently, Carlos is in the last year of his PHD at Tallinn University, where he also teaches documentary filmmaking.

His film work varies in style and genres, from science fiction and dance to experimental and narrative dramas, always carrying raw emotions and energy and has been screened in festivals around the world like Fantasia Film Festival, Black Nights Film Festival and Bogoshorts.

His first Documentary feature A Loss of Something Ever felt premiered in Hot docs in 2020 and received the Best Documentary film Award at the Estonian Film and Television Awards in 2021.


MERILI LAUR

LOGLINE:

As violent crises return to Europe's edge, Borderline follows locals who cross and question the visible and invisible borders shaping their lives.

SYNOPSIS:

In the deep woods, wastelands and postindustrial towns of Estonia and Finland, locals have generations of experience surviving border conflicts between great powers. Borderline takes the spectator on an absurd journey to the inbetween worlds. The film travels to Karelia for a mushroom tea and to Setomaa for an ether ceremony, and tells how to protect oneself from the sirens of the forest. In the borderlands, the main characters live on many kinds of borders, refusing to let norms decide who they are.

Borderline searches for spiritual experiences, altered states of mind, and moments of contact with otherworldly beings. What lies on the other side? Can one travel from one world to another, from one reality to the next? The film moves between the concrete and the symbolic, showing how borders shape our lives in today's world. From the periphery, one can sometimes see more clearly into the core.

VILLE SEPPÄNEN

DIRECTOR

Ville Seppänen has worked as a scenographer in theatres across Europe for years. Borderline is his first feature-length documentary. He is happy with

this border crossing and feels at home in liminal spaces. Seppänen has made three short documentary films: Coq Au Vin, screened at Pärnu Film Festival, Happy Independence Day, screened at Tampere International Film Festival, and Happy Fucking New Year, screened at Premieres Regards festival. Seppänen's artmaking is characterized by exploration of boundaries.

JOHAN HUIMERIND

DIRECTOR & PRODUCER

Johan Huimerind (b. 1991) is a diverse filmmaker with a background in photography, filmmaking, and production. A relatively young talent in the industry,

he has directed, produced, and shot a variety of documentary shorts. Currently, Johan is working on his feature-length debut, Laskumine Orgu, as well as his television debut, Maarjamaa Salatoimikud. In addition to his creative work, Johan has contributed to the Pärnu Film Festival as an organizer. He holds a Master's degree in Documentary Filmmaking from University of Tallinn (2022). They are united by the power of music, movement and the deepest message of tango: accept, listen and communicate. But will it ever be possible to dance again with a former partner who has become an enemy? Does tango give a man what even the gods have failed to do; a chance to connect with those left on the other side of the border?

Annika Grof is a Swedish-born Finnish screenwriter and film director. She has also worked as a developer, dramatist and funding expert in film, tv and commercial productions since 2006. Annika has created and conceptualised successful series for the Finnish audience and has also directed three theatrical films in addition to other artistic work. As a filmmaker, Annika works with fiction and non-fiction films. Her latest film works are a timeless epoch drama There Will Be Spring (2020), that got its international premiere at Midnight Sun Film Festival in June 2021, and an edgy and popping collage documentary The Other Voice (2022). One of her best known films is Within Limits (2009) that has become a classic of Finnish documentary films.

Joon Tervakari is a Finnish film producer and founder of Tarasow Films (2007). With a background spanning television, film, commercials and art, he has worked both as an editor and a producer. LOGLINE:

Could it be safe to die?

SYNOPSIS:

How We Die is an intimate documentary that takes us, together with fresh hospice volunteers, to the banks at the end of the river of life, where they encounter and help the dying.

After four months of initial training, the volunteers move on to take shifts in the ward of the terminally ill. The first steps are exciting; death understandably carries a tremendous weight - how to approach, interact, and be with the patients without doing something inappropriate? The importance of listening and being present is emphasized as the volunteers try to find clues for their next actions, or no actions for that matter.

Secretly the volunteers want to find something for themselves, something that would ease the heavy feeling of being a human in this life. As they spend time with patients from all ages and walks of life, helping where needed, the volunteers are touched, and they open up about their most intimate thoughts and yearnings. And why is death easy for someone and very difficult



LOGLINE:

It doesn't make Nikke's desire any easier when his Brain escapes to look for a new body—and love.

SYNOPSIS:

Runaway Brain combines documentary footage with animation, where Nikke's Brain jumps out of his skull and sets off on an adventure through a drawn world. It is a world Nikke intuitively creates each day, like a visual diary, using comic-like drawings filled with sharp humour, serious thoughts, and strong emotions.

Nikke's drawings reflect reality in a unique way, shaped in part by his experience of living with Down syndrome. The characters and scenes are often absurd, leaving plenty of room for interpretation. Speech bubbles ask questions: 'Who do I want to become? How do I deal with depression? Why do I need to draw?'

Animation is the way to follow Brain's journey through joy, desires, and the darkness of depression before returning to the light.

Nikke photographs his drawings and shares them on Facebook, where he refers to himself by the alias "downinsyndroma-human." His posts

LOGLINE:

A Mexican telenovela takes Estonia by storm in 1993 and reaches viewership records that remain unchallenged to this day. Portraying the absurdity of the times through the eyes of a 10-year-old girl and her everyday life, a lively journey full of humour, hardships, and endless personal desires will take us from collectivism to individualism.

SYNOPSIS:

The Story of the Wild Rose is a return to a unique moment in time when two very different worlds collided in Estonia in 1993. After Estonia's National Television accidentally acquired a soap opera, no one could have predicted the telenovela craze that followed. The streets were empty, people gathered around televisions in homes, factories and offices for half an hour of escapism from their grey and dreary realities in the poor and difficult years of rebuilding a country. It brought people together, ignited endless discussions on topics that had not been explored before; it even changed the way children and adults spoke. Mixing archives with re-enactments, a 10-year-old girl relives the collective euphoria and its stark social contrast.

The recent films she produced through her company Klara Films Lembri Uudu (2017), The Weight of All the Beauty (2019), A Loss of Something Ever Felt (2020), and two co-productions, Jesus Shows You the Way to the Highway (2019) and Lynxman (2023) – have all been international festival successes, having been premiered, screened and awarded at festivals like DOK Leipzig, Sarajevo, Hot Docs, Melbourne IFF, Ji.hlava, Visions du Réel, CPH:DOX, Fantasia, and many more. With a deep sensitivity to both form and feeling, she has taught editing for over a decade at the Baltic Film School and abroad. A member of the European Film Academy, she is currently exploring film editing as artistic research.

Kaupo Kruusiauk graduated from the Baltic Film and Media School with a bachelor's degree in film directing, and from the Estonian Academy of Music and Theatre with a master's degree in theatre and film directing. Kaupo has directed several short films, one full-length feature film (Sandra saab tööd, 2021), and a few episodes of the project Estonian Stories for Estonian Public Broadcasting (Murust, Teaduse nimel, Kütt).

In his documentaries, Kaupo Kruusiauk has explored the chess player Jaan Ehlvest (Mängija, 2008), actor and musician Peeter Volkonski (Viimane vürst, 2018), musician and composer Maria Faust (Machina Faust, 2022) and topranked tennis player Anett Kontaveit (Anett, 2024). Machina Faust stands as Kaupo Kruusiauk's most acclaimed film. The Estonian Association of Film Journalists named it the best Estonian movie of 2022. Concurrently it was selected as the best Estonian documentary in 2022 at the Estonian Film and felevision Awards gala. Machina Faust has been selected for the programme of CPH:DOX, Krakow Film Festival, Baltic Film Days, and New York Baltic Film Festival.

LOGLINE:

SYNOPSIS:

Actors Haide and Toomas are a beloved clown duo, Piip and Tuut, who have won the hearts of families in Estonia and abroad over the past 25 years. They have their own theatre and a loyal fanbase—but also three children who grow up mostly without them.

As Haide and Toomas juggle life on stage and at home, guilt and exhaustion begin to grow. How do you build a future for your children, keep your theatre alive, and stay together?

A heartfelt story of love, sacrifice, and the everyday circus of family life.

LOGLINE:

A film director clinging to a romanticized Poland searches for the mining heroes of her childhood. **SYNOPSIS:**

Director Oliwia had a happy childhood in Poland, where coal miners were national heroes. After moving to Finland at age 8 in 1987, socialist Poland remained frozen in her romantic childhood memories where the truth was different.

Thirty years later, Oliwia returns to look for her childhood heroes. She wants to explore the Silesian coal mining region. Climate change and Europe's green transition are forcing mines to close, and coal miners must find a new direction for their lives.

Three experienced coal miners show the shrinking mining towns that young people are leaving behind. Former workplaces are turned into museums and mining orchestras play their final notes. The whole culture is disappearing.

Oliwia's own experience of immigration parallels the miners' situation. Both have lost the culture that used to define their identity and they are moving toward accepting change.

LOGLINE:

At the edge of Europe, on the Estonian–Russian border, a Soviet-era tank monument becomes a weapon in a contemporary battle over identity, history, and political allegiance between communities

SYNOPSIS:

On the Estonian-Russian border, a Sovietera WWII tank monument embodies two irreconcilable truths: for Russians it tells a Soviet story of liberation and triumph, while for Estonians it recalls occupation and loss. Russia's war in Ukraine reopens these wounds, and when the government decides to remove the tank, the monument itself becomes a symbolic weapon in an escalating identity-driven conflict. Totem explores how history, nostalgia, and trauma are revived and reshaped by present-day politics and propaganda. Through a collective portrait of people divided by memory and allegiance, the film shows how history is not only remembered but weaponized—turning monuments into battlefields and humans into agents in a modern hybrid warfare.

ICE AND FIRE DOCS

Ice and Fire Docs is a creative documentary workshop for Estonian and Finnish filmmakers with international ambitions. Throughout the workshop the participants work with different aspects of developing, producing, financing and distributing a feature length documentary film.

The workshop lasts for a year and consists of three parts. The first and second sessions focus on the development of narrative, visual aspects of storytelling and editing techniques. The last session has a focus on promotion and distribution.

Ice and Fire Docs took place for the first time in 2019. It was initiated by the Estonian Documentary Guild and the Estonian Film Institute and is now being organised in close cooperation with the Finnish Documentary Guild. The workshop is funded by the Estonian Film Institute, the Cultural Endowment of Estonia, the Promotion Centre for Audiovisual Culture in Finland AVEK and Finnish Film Foundation.
